The Prairie Arts Council announces their production of Deathtrap, a thriller-mystery-comedy. Deathtrap will be performed in conjunction with Princeton's 48th Annual Homestead Festival on September 6 and 7 at 7:30 p.m. and September 8 at 2:00 p.m.

Director Joe Ennenbach of Peru has cast five local actors, including: Ken Schroeder of Princeton as Sindey Bruhl, Karen Roger of Utica as Myra Bruhl, Josh Bush of Princeton as Clifford Anderson, Jill Marti of Princeton as Helga ten Dorp, and Gary Talsky of Spring Valley as Porter Pilgrim.

Deathtrap is produced by special arrangement with Dramatists Play Service, Inc. Written by Ira Levin, it is the story of Sidney Bruhl (Ken Schroeder), a successful writer of Broadway thrillers, who is struggling to overcome a dry spell which has resulted in a string of failures and a shortage of funds. A possible break in his fortunes occurs when he receives a script from Clifford Anderson (Josh Bush) a student in the seminar he has been conducting at a nearby college—a thriller that Sidney recognizes immediately as a potential Broadway smash. Sidney's plan, devised with his wife Myra's (Karen Roger) help, is to offer collaboration to the student for co-credit. Or is it? Add in wacky medium Helga ten Dorp (Jill Marti) and the Bruhl family lawyer, Porter Milgrim (Gary Talsky) and Deathtrap provides twists and turns of devilish cleverness, and offers hilariously sudden shocks in such abundance that audiences will be spellbound until the very last moment.

Production staff also includes production manager Dixie Schroeder, Dave Walters on set construction, costumer Jill Marti, stage manager Maddie Devert, and set artist Laurie Innes. Tickets may be purchased online at prairiearts.org or by leaving a message at 815-875-2787.

ANNUAL MEETING

Our annual meeting was held Friday, May 3rd in the PAC Gallery. Kevin Shyne, president of the Prairie Arts Council Board of Directors, summarized the many events that were made possible by our members, contributors and volunteers.

Since the beginning of 2018 we have hosted nine theater programs, ranging from a Neil Simon comedy to the Barbershop Chorus concert to our annual children's Christmas musical, for a total attendance of 1325. We also implemented a new online ticketing system, and this season we will be staging a production for the Homestead Festival called "Deathtrap".

We have also hosted twelve exhibitions in our Gallery space featuring a wide variety of expression; everything from Coca-Cola memorabilia to quilting and textile art, from photography to folk art, painting and woodworking. We also enjoyed hosting a holiday tradition — the Christmas Mini-Tree Festival. We had over a thousand visitors to these wonderful exhibits!

Thanks to your generosity (and with the help of a Bake Sale and organizations like Church Women United, OmniArts, the Illinois Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts), we have a solid financial foundation and are starting to investigate a capital campaign to expand the building for a backstage area, dressing areas and storage area for costumes and props.

We were also able to host three workshops for young people including a summer art camp, summer drama camp and a creative writing festival for high school students, and we are committed to continue bringing arts programming to young people in our community.

This has been memorable year!
