#### ARTIST'S STATEMENT:

This exhibit will be an extension of my recent solo show at Open Space called "Passerby". Passerby really kicked into gear ideas that I have had for years. They are just now molding into something real.

The artworks will be a series of paintings on canvas along with shape cut-outs that are taken from a collection of drawings I have done with my eyes closed. I began drawing with my eyes closed in 2016 and have been doing it ever since. It is my way of experiencing the world without clearly defining representation surrounding me.

I trace the shapes I see within the static behind my eyelids onto paper, then I decipher the lines, cut them away, and rearrange to make something new.
