A Winterhaven Christmas

PAC's Annual Children's Christmas Production 2009, "A Winterhaven Christmas" will be presented November 19th – 22nd.

Stranded at their grandmother's house in the country over the holidays, five young cousins venture into the attic to explore and find a book hidden in a locked trunk. As one of the children reads the book out loud, they suddenly find themselves face to face with the daughter of an Archduke, a wicked sorceress, and one of her minions, who step right out of the book into the dusty attic. But when the sorceress disappears, the princess remains in the attic and one of the children is gone, taken captive by the sorceress. With the help of their grandmother and more colorful storybook characters, the children set about on an adventure to return the Archduke's daughter to her home and free their lost cousin.

California Suite, Neil Simon's smash comedy from the 1970's was performed in the Prairie Arts Center theatre October 9-11. A cast and crew of locals from Princeton, LaSalle, DePue, Malden, and Tiskilwa

performed to 130 attendees over the three day run. Director Dixie Schroeder was pleased with the results. "I am very proud of our local community theatre scene. It has been a while since local actors and actresses were seen on stage in a show in the area. Our cast of 3 women, and 4 men playing multiple parts did wonderfully." Acting in the show were Rachel Gorenz, Jill Marti, and Tiffany Smith along with Dick Dorsch, Pete Hamilton, Cliff Peddicord, and Ken Schroeder.

Technical crew included Dylan Carlson, Taylor Carlson and Jim Hays. "It doesn't have to be huge to be a success," continued Schroeder. Updating the play to the 1990's, Simon's script highlighted scenarios from his married life that brought great comic moments.


