Start Your Holiday Season with the 2010 Children's Christmas Show Dec. 3-5

The script is written, the roles cast, and rehearsals are underway for this year's Children's Theater Christmas Musical: *The One, the Only, Christmas Fairy Queen!* PAC was fortunate to have over thirty children audition.

This year's Christmas show is the story of Sam, who is kidnapped by a pair of 1920s gangster wanna-bes who work for Neva, the evil twin of the Christmas Fairy Queen. Neva had tried to destroy the true spirit of Christmas generations ago by "eliminating" her good sister. Her ploy backfired, however, and, years later, Sam, the first female descendent of the Christmas Fairy, gains her magical powers when she turns 13 (completely unbeknownst to her).

Neva begins to regain her power, but needs to destroy Sam to achieve complete control. Sam, however, is rescued by the Fairy Queen's Court, an eccentric collection of fairies, Christmas animals, and quirky people, and the Christmas Ornaments, who have been watching over Sam and her ancestors ever since the time of the Christmas Fairy. Unfortunately, Neva regains the upper hand for a time, and Sam makes a courageous choice to sacrifice herself to save the Fairy Queen's Court and Christmas Ornaments, setting in motion the touching climax to the show.

This year's production will again showcase familiar and not-so-familiar Christmas carols. The talents of our young actors are being stretched with challenging roles such as a French Can-Can dancer, a Granny Clampet-inspired Southern Belle, an insomniac elf, a pair of secret agents (Agents Tannen and Baum), and many others.

Controlling the Climate in the Prairie Arts Center

The Prairie Arts Council has been awarded a \$16,881 Energy Efficiency grant through the North Central Illinois Council of Governments. This grant represents 75% of the cost of completely replacing the highly energy inefficient HVAC heating and air conditioning systems in both the gallery and the theater of the PAC.

Currently the gallery HVAC system is 69% efficient and the theater 90.3% efficient. These units will be replaced with American-made HVAC systems that are 95.5% efficient.

The PAC grant was submitted under the jurisdiction of the City of Princeton as the local unit of government for this

grant. No funds from the City of Princeton will be used in this grant, and the city will only serve as the flow-through for the grant funds.

The Prairie Arts Council Board is very grateful to the City of Princeton and Mayor Keith Cain for allowing the PAC to apply for this beneficial grant. Since the only sources of revenue for the PAC include donations, grants,memberships and fund-raising, this special project would not have been possible without this grant and the support of the City of Princeton as well as the continued financial support of the Prairie Arts Council members and friends.
