The Covered Bridge Quilters Guild was established in 1992. The guild promotes the education, history and caring of quilts through lectures, demonstrations, workshops and field trips. There are 81 guild members with interests ranging from traditional quilting to modern art quilts. Members have had quilts displayed at national shows as well as the

Hoffman Challenge Quilts Show. One of the guild members is certified to appraise quilts through the American Quilters Society, and several guild members hand and machine quilt for others.

Just a sampling of what to expect at the Photographer's Unlimited show during the month of May.

A First Friday Opening Reception will be held and open to the public on Friday, May 7 from 5-7 p.m. with wine and appetizers and a chance to view the Photographers Unlimited art show. The show will be open on Saturdays and Sundays from 1-4 p.m. and on Wednesday evenings from 6-8 p.m. In addition, a special photography program will also be presented on Wed. May 12 at 7:00 p.m.

Photographers Unlimited was founded in 1978 with nine original members and today there are thirty members from Princeton and the surrounding area. The club's purpose is to provide diversified photographic interests, to provide the opportunity to meet in good fellowship with other people with similar photographic interests, to give the novice and expert photographers alike a forum from which to share and learn, and to promote the many exciting facets that photography has to offer. The club is a member of the Central Illinois Camera Club which unites local area camera clubs and promotes the photographic interests of their members. Photographers Unlimited meet on the 4th Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m. at the Bureau County Republican community room, and the club sponsors photographic field trips, contests, educational opportunities and many other activities. This special photography show at the Prairie Arts Center will highlight the diversity and excellence of their photographic achievements.

Gultural Data PROJECT

The Cultural Data Project is a national model for data collection for arts and cultural organizations. It allows users to track financial and programming performance over time and to compare themselves to other similar organizations in other regions and disciplines. It tells the story of an organization's assets, contributions and needs to advocates, policymakers and researchers.

For example, would you believe that 2323 individuals attended 9 different productions and 7 gallery exhibitions involving 173 artists and performers at the PAC? Would you believe that 360 individuals donated a total of 8937 hours to the PAC? And did you know that our revenues in 2009 totaled nearly \$30,000?

Illinois has joined six other states in implementing this project, and allows us to run dozens of reports that help track and evaluate our organization's activities, finances, attendance, and influence in the community. Julie McCutchan and Liz Draper attended the training seminar in January and have completed the Data Profile for the Prairie Arts Council.

Entry deadline is June 12, 2010. Pre-registration fee is \$25. Registration fee May 15 – June 12 is \$30.

Theater Upgrades to Start After Curtain Closes on Oliver!

Brett Hall from Commercial Sound has been logging in many hours as he installs the new theater sound system donated by the Brown family and the Optimist's Club. We look forward to many years of use from this much needed improvement. Of particular interest will be the headsets that will allow the stage manager to communicate with the light technician without running around the building!



Our next step toward improving the physical plant will be to renovate and paint the inside of the theater.

Under the artistic direction of Princeton High School junior Dylan Carlson, plans are underway to scrub and repair cracks in the walls, provide removable insulated inserts in four of the windows to replace the current coverings on the inside, and to paint the interior of the theater to create a warm, cozy environment.

The painting plan will also minimize the distraction from the ornate pillars on the stage while maintaining their architectural integrity; and plywood facing on the back walls of the stage will eliminate the need for the unsightly two by fours that are currently required for fastening set pieces. "Gold" leaf highlights on some of the ornate features near the ceiling and recessed lighting will provide a touch of class to top off, quite literally, this project.

Many volunteers will be needed to assist with this project, which we hope will be begin in early May, right after *Oliver!*
