# Prairie Arts Council Honors Nedda Simon

Simon will be the Second Recipient of the Lifetime Achievements in the Arts Award at this year's Gala.

The sixteenth annual Prairie Arts Council's gala will be held on Friday, February 4th at 7 PM at the Wine Cellar in Princeton. This vear the Prairie Arts Council will honor local arts supporter and educator, Nedda Simon for her "Lifetime Achievements in the Arts." Nedda was born into a musical family. Her mother was an opera singer who taught in the public schools and taught

piano and singing to both Nedda and her sister Carol. Nedda studied at the Quincy Conservatory of Music and graduated from the Northwestern School of Speech majoring in the theater arts and public speaking as well as earning her teaching certificate. Nedda appeared in USO shows, the Springfield Municipal Opera Company, recitals and plays. She taught English and Speech in both the Princeton and Manlius Schools as well as working with the high school plays.

Professionally, Nedda had a great interest in counseling and worked with Quad County Counseling in outreach and drug and alcohol counseling, specializing in women. During that time, she also had her own private counseling practice as well as being the founder of Freedom House. She was a talk show host on WZOE for seventeen years. In addition, she was actively involved in community activities and served on the original committee that established the Prairie Arts Council and that purchased the building that now houses the Prairie Arts Center. She continued her interest in music and theater and served on both the Princeton Theater Group Board and now the steering committee for the Illinois Conservatory. Nedda has always had a lifelong interest and support of the arts and feels that there is a joy of the arts that raises the spirit. She has been very influential in raising the awareness and appreciation of the arts.

This is the second "Lifetime Achievements in the Arts" award that will be made to recognize and honor special people like Nedda Simon who have made such important contributions to the arts. Mary Win Norris was the first recipient of this special reward at last year's gala.

The gala is the main fund-raiser for the Prairie Arts Council, and these funds will be used to continue and

# Will Rogers: An American Original - Coming for 2 shows on Sunday, March 6 at 2:00 and 7:30 p.m. to the PAC Theater

#### One-man Show Pays Homage to Great Cowboy Philosopher

The Prairie Arts Council is proud to present *Will Rogers: An American Original*, written and performed by 3-time JEFF nominee Kevin McKillip. This one-man show explores the life and times of America's most popular humorist.

At the time of his death in 1935, Will Rogers hosted the number one radio show in America, had a daily column that ran in over 400 papers, and was the number one male box office star for three years running. In the course of a career that included both Texas Jack's Wild West Show and the Ziegfeld Follies, Will Rogers invented the American stand-up comic. Using his trick roping skills to punctuate his delivery, Will Rogers' folksy humor set the groundwork for everyone from Bob Hope to Johnny Carson to David Letterman.

Will was born on a ranch near the town of Oologah in Indian Territory (now Oklahoma). His mother was 1/4 Cherokee and his father 3/8 Cherokee and Will used to say, "I never got far enough in arithmetic to figure out what that made me."

His observations on government, the economy, and society are as timely now as when he first made them. On his political affiliations: "I'm not a member of any organized political party. I'm a Democrat." Of the Stock Market Crash: "If stupidity got us into this mess, then why can't it get us out?" Concerning taxes: "The Republicans now, they are accusing the Democrats of raising taxes. This upsets the Republicans because if Democrats do most of the tax raising, the Republicans do most of the tax paying."

Famous for the statement, "I never met a man I didn't like," Will Rogers is the quintessential image of the common man.

Proceeds from these performances will go toward the Prairie Arts Council's required 25% of the costs associated with the HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) upgrades. The other 75% of the cost was covered by the Energy Efficiency Grant that was awarded through the North Central Illinois Council of Governments. This grant represents 75% of the cost of completely replacing the highly energy inefficient HVAC heating and air conditioning systems in both the gallery and the theater of the PAC.

The Prairie Arts Council is proud to present the "Fashion: The Art of the Hat" art show featuring the hat collection of Julia Cain of Princeton. Julia has a collection of over 700 hats that she has been collecting since a college shopping trip with her roommates to a Goodwill Store where they all bought hats, including winter hats and berets.



From there, Julia began a lifelong interest in collecting hats of all kinds, hat stands, hat pins, cards and pictures of ladies wearing hats. She is especially interested in the Victorian style of vintage hats but also collects hats of all styles and materials. She has found hats to collect at the Closet, auctions, antique stores, and from friends. Julia sees hats as showing a different aspect of specific people's style or a part of their style signature. She remembers when her mother made her own hats, including a stylish pheasant hat. Originally hats were used for protection from the weather and even though hats are not worn as often as in the past, young people are now wearing hats and scarves as part of their wardrobes.

Julia's show at the Prairie Arts Center Gallery in Princeton features a wide range of hats, hat stands, hat pins and other accessories that make fashion statements. 
