## PAC Gallery to host 'an emerging artist'

# Opening reception set for Sept. 6

Barry Mayworm, a new and emerging artist from Princeton, will exhibit his original artwork in the Prairie Arts Center Gallery through the month of September, beginning with an opening reception from 6 to 8 p.m. Friday, Sept. 6.

Using watercolors, Barry has developed his own unique style called the "mottled look," which uses marks of various colors and textures to create expressive and enduring images. His art includes landscapes and florals that celebrate the beauty of nature. He also paints cityscapes, which illustrate the architecture and vitality of our city. Barry is a perpetual student of art, always exploring new and interesting ways of creating art.

This original watercolor exhibit can be viewed through Sept. 22 during gallery hours from 10 a.m. to noon Wednesdays and from 1 to 4 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays. The public is invited to attend the opening reception Sept. 6. The exhibit will be open extended hours during the Homestead Festival weekend, from noon to 5 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 14 and from noon to 2 p.m. and 4 to 5 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 15. (The gallery will be closed during the Homestead Talent Showcase presented at 2 p.m.)

Barry will give a special presentation about his creative process, from initial concept to final creation, titled "How I Build a Painting" at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 11. This event is free and open to the public.

### Zentangle

This fun, meditative, relaxing art form, sometimes referred to as "yoga for your brain," is quickly becoming popular among artists and non-artists alike. The goals of Zentangle are to increase focus and creativity while providing artistic satisfaction. A type of doodling, Zentangle is a pen and ink technique that encourages creativity and relaxation with the use of invented repetitive patterns. We will work in a small-group format to make a completed black and white 3.5" x 3.5" paper tile. A second take-home project may also be started as time allows.

This workshop will be presented by Linda Fine, a certified Zentangle teacher (otherwise known as a CZT), who received her certification in June 2013 in Providence, Rhode Island. Linda is also currently teaching art at Reagan Middle School in Tiskilwa.
