In 1995, John Henning, Ron McCutchan, Deb Puetz and the late Mary Win Walter Norris created an executive committee in the name of the Princeton Fine Arts Council. Their goal was modest: they wanted to help promote fine arts in any way, shape or form. From the first fundraiser, to present day, the group made their home in the Christian Science Church, 24 Park Avenue East in Princeton. The "PAC" has evolved with a complete theater, gallery and facilities to host classes yearround. This year's Prairie Arts Council Gala will be dedicated to these four individuals with Special



NEW WORK

The Prairie Arts Council will present a show of area art teachers' work in its gallery from October 2 through October 25. This is the fourth time the teachers have exhibited together. Thirteen artists will be exhibiting using a variety of mediums and materials to express ideas about their work. There will be photography, ceramics, mixed media works, paintings, pastels, assemblages, pen and ink, low-relief wall hangings and jewelry on display. Most of the work will be offered for sale during the show.

Show organizer Kathy Ballard states that "this time many artists in the show tried new mediums or completely different subject matter for their work. It was exciting to see them push their work forward to a higher level of expression, and to challenge themselves by creating art outside their comfort zones. This show should appeal to the public because of the variety of art work on display; and it will be nice to see what area art teachers are doing on their own when they are not in their classrooms with their students."

The opening reception will be October 2, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Prairie Arts Center Gallery. Visitors may talk with artists and enjoy wine, punch, and appetizers as they view the exhibit. Gallery hours for the show will be 1:00- 4:00 p.m.on Saturdays and 10:00-Noon on Wednesdays. The Prairie Arts Center is located at 24 Park Avenue East in Princeton.

Annual Children's Production

CHRISTMAS BANISHED

PAC's 2015 Community Theater Children's Christmas Musical is titled *Christmas Banished*. Continuing an 11 year tradition, the show was written by PAC resident playwright Rachel Gorenz-Johnson, director of PAC's Children's Summer Drama Camp and Children's Christmas shows. *Christmas Banished* was originally produced on the PAC stage in 2008; the script was adapted after auditions this year to accentuate the talents, skills, and abilities of this cast. As with previous years, the script was not completed until after auditions, so that many of the roles could be written to of the individual actors.

The show follows the travails of the Coalition of Holiday Cheer, a committee made up of the major holiday figures: Tom Turkey, Uncle Sam, Cupid, and others. Through the conniving of the malcontent Elf, Frost, the Coalition members come to believe that Santa Claus does not think that they deserve their own holidays. The Coalition votes to banish Santa and Christmas from the Coalition, setting in motion a fun filled chain of events including a makeover of Christmas (a desperate attempt by some loyal elves to save Christmas from extinction), the manipulation of Rudolph to become a singing partner with Suzie Snowflake, and Cupid letting loose his arrows during a climactic battle scene.

Our Christmas Mini-Tree Festival would not be possible without talented people like you! If you (or one of your employees) are interested in entering a tree, wreath, or tabletop design in our festival of mini-trees, complete this form and return it by mail to the Prairie Arts Council, 24 Park Avenue East, Princeton, IL 61356 before November 7 to ensure inclusion into the Festival. Any questions may be directed to Pam Hanson at 815-915-3368 or by calling the Prairie Arts Council at 815-875-2787.

A designer is a creative individual or team who donates a tree, wreath or table top design to the Prairie Arts Council to be used as a silent auction item to help PAC raise funds in support of community arts programming. Judging will take place prior to the opening reception. All winners will be publicly announced. This is a good opportunity to get your business and design talents noticed.

As a designer, your tree is viewed by hundreds of attendees. Every design stays up the entire two weeks. If you incorporate lights into your design, be sure to use a new string of lights. We are not responsible if the lights burn out during the exhibit. We will take every step to make sure your design is properly presented. All designs must be submitted with a title and your name. All trees and wreaths will be presented with an identical name card for consistency in the display. ALL TREES SHOULD BE NO LARGER THAN 30 INCHES TALL! A limited supply of trees and wreaths to start your design are available from Prairie Arts Council at no charge and will be given on a first come, first serve basis.

When considering what to do for your tree, wreath, or tabletop design, please keep in mind that it should have a somewhat broad appeal while maintaining a themed uniqueness to attract as many buyers as possible. The Prairie Arts Center will be open November 14 and 15 from 1-3 pm to receive all Designs. We cannot guarantee a proper space for your design after November 15.

All entries are welcome! There is no fee to enter.
